

A View from Calvary



Come and See

Little Michael Damir is a regular member of our Sunday School and last summer he attended Vacation Bible School. His parents told me that he was very happy, talked about God with them after the VBS was over. One day at school, a friend of Michael found out that he attended VBS last summer. One thing led to another, and Michael said:

"I love God more than anybody."

"Who's God?" asked his little friend.

"I don't know," said Michael.

"Is he from the commercial?" asked his friend.

"No," said Michael.

"He looks like you?" said his friend.

"No, he doesn't look like me; he doesn't have teeth." responded Michael.

The teacher, who overheard the conversation, interrupted their discussion by asking Michael, "What else do you know about God?"

After thinking for a moment, Michael responded:

"God is strong; God is real except you cannot see Him. He died and went to heaven then he came back to life."

I love little Michael's honest answer. No wonder Jesus told us that unless we are like little children, we will not have a place in the Kingdom of God.

I am challenged by one of the youngest members of CACC to find that he takes the invitation "Come and see" seriously.

This sentence was used by Jesus and his disciples to invite people to follow Jesus. John the Baptist sent his two disciples to follow the "Lamb of God." When they saw Jesus, they called him "Rabbi", our teacher. They also wanted to know what Jesus did, and where he stayed. Jesus said, "Come and see."

Andrew was one of those disciples who obeyed and followed Jesus. However, the first thing Andrew did was to go and invite his brother Simon, who was later known as Peter. We do not know much about Andrew. We only know that he was a

disciple of Jesus. His name is mentioned in the Bible only three times, and at all these occasion he was inviting people to come to meet Jesus.

God wants ordinary people to invite people to Him. People who are not preachers, who are not prophets, whose names are not written on the first pages of magazines. They are people of the "second seat." Yet, their task in inviting people is unique and exceptional.

We see ordinary people like the Samaritan woman. Jesus was thirsty. The Samaritan woman was there with a bucket. She was surprised that a Jewish man would talk to her and ask for water. In the end when the conversation went further and deeper, she asked for living water from Jesus. Then she left everything, even her bucket, and went to the village and invited her people "Come and see..."

I love little Michael's response when he said he did not know who God was. He was honest. Yet, he felt God's presence in his life and he liked to share it with his friend. You do not have to have all the answers in order to invite someone to God. I am not asking big things from you. I am asking a simple thing. **Share your testimony** with your friends, neighbors, colleagues.

We are called to be light and salt. It is not a choice. It should be done.

Our slogan for this year is the following: **Know Christ and make Him known**.

Knowing Christ was stressed in our last year's slogan: <u>Plug In to God</u>. We cannot ignore that theme and therefore our ministries that help us plug in to God will continue this year as well. However, I want to emphasize this year the second part of our slogan: **to Make Him Known**. There are many who do not have the taste of Jesus Christ as their personal savior.

I once read by Brian Bill about something he called BLT: Build relationships, Look for opportunities, and Take non-Christians to outreach events. We need to move and put it in practice. Therefore, go, invite and say: COME AND SEE.

The largest concentrations of Armenians are in the cities of Plovdiv and Sofia, where they have their churches, schools and various Armenian organizations.

There has been an Armenian Evangelical community ever since the early nineteen hundreds and presently there are six Armenian Evangelical & Methodist Churches in the cities of Burgas, Plovdiv, Russe, Shumen, Sofia and Varna.

Arpi and I had the opportunity of worshiping with our brothers and sisters in Christ in Sofia. The Armenian Evangelical Church of Sofia was established in 1933, and presently they meet in one of the auxiliary halls


