Graduation Sunday







This year we honored those who graduated from school on June 28th, 2009. The range of ages ran from pre-school to dental school which includes 21 graduates.


In the worship service, our scripture lesson was from the Parable of

A total of more than 100 ladies from various churches in California gathered in San Luis Obispo on September 25-27 to enjoy a weekend of spiritual nourishment and Christian fellowship. The speaker was Major Lucy Der Garabedian and the theme was "Serve the Lord with Gladness."

This summer we had 36 children attending our VBS program entitled Crocodile Dock - Where Fearless Kids Shine God's Light. Our program ran from July 20th - 24th, from 10:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. With aftercare from 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. It was a great week of learning and fellowship.

Through Crocodile Dock's exciting, funfilled, Bible based program, the children learned that God is with us, God is powerful, God does what He says He'll do, God gives us life, and God cares for us.

These daily Bible points were carefully integrated into each station activity to

reinforce learning. Our station activities started with Sing & Play Swamp Stomp (worship and praise time), then Bible Bayou (bible story and prayer time), Snack Shack (snack time), Crawfish Crafts (arts and crafts time), Gator Games (play time), and the Firefly Finale (wrap up and Bible memory verse time).

Kids were encouraged to keep an eye out for "God in action" in their everyday lives, and to take notice of the daily demonstrations of His love that are often overlooked.

The total cost for the week per child was \$35.00. This included a T-shirt, crafts and snacks. For children who attended the aftercare, it was an additional \$20.00 for the week including lunch.

A memorial service celebrating Lee's life was held on September 25, 2009, at 11:00 am at Calvary Congregational Armenian Church on Brotherhood Way in San Francisco.

The Message of Hope

Calvary Armenian Congregational Church welcomed Mrs. Rakel Dink, wife of late Hrant Dink, to join our church family on Sunday, October 4th, 2009. It was an honor for an audience of over two hundred to hear such a heartfelt message aimed towards understanding the demands of life in Turkey, and in the words of Rakel, also choosing to be "crucified for justice as the better choice."



presentation began with a film documentary about Hrant Dink's passion for justice and mercy, and included early influences that shaped his character. Growing up in an Armenian Evangelical

boarding school in Gedik Pasha, Istanbul, he soaked up all he could about God's Word. After his death, his

family suffered and grappled with this concept he dearly consumed as a child. That is – Rakel Dink focused on God's promises.

Her personal story, the story of first hearing the news about her beloved's death – demonstrates the human weakness and vulnerability that come with loss. "Such tragedy tests your faith," Rakel says. Her son's question that resides in every mind wonders why a tragedy is allowed for someone who truly believed in and followed Christ. Her daughter doubts she's living in a new day and age since 1915. Situations like this test our faith.

In such turmoil and confusion, what must one do? Rakel's answer is to turn your eyes to Christ. At a time where our physical bodies are defined by weakness, God is our strength. Many questions remain unanswered but God's Word is constant and she reiterates, "Thoughts of God are far from thoughts of men." By turning to her faith, she's found the strength to use this opportunity to praise God, even in the midst of such difficult circumstances. There will be struggle, there will be suffering, and there will continue the realities of life in Turkey as they are. Rakel's message is simple. "Get up, be strong, and show your Christian faith "— use every opportunity given to you, in the best of times, or the worst of times.

Meeting this woman of faith remains an unforgettable experience. She has greatly inspired all of us. May God protect her and keep her safe so she will be the light and salt in Turkey and around the world.


