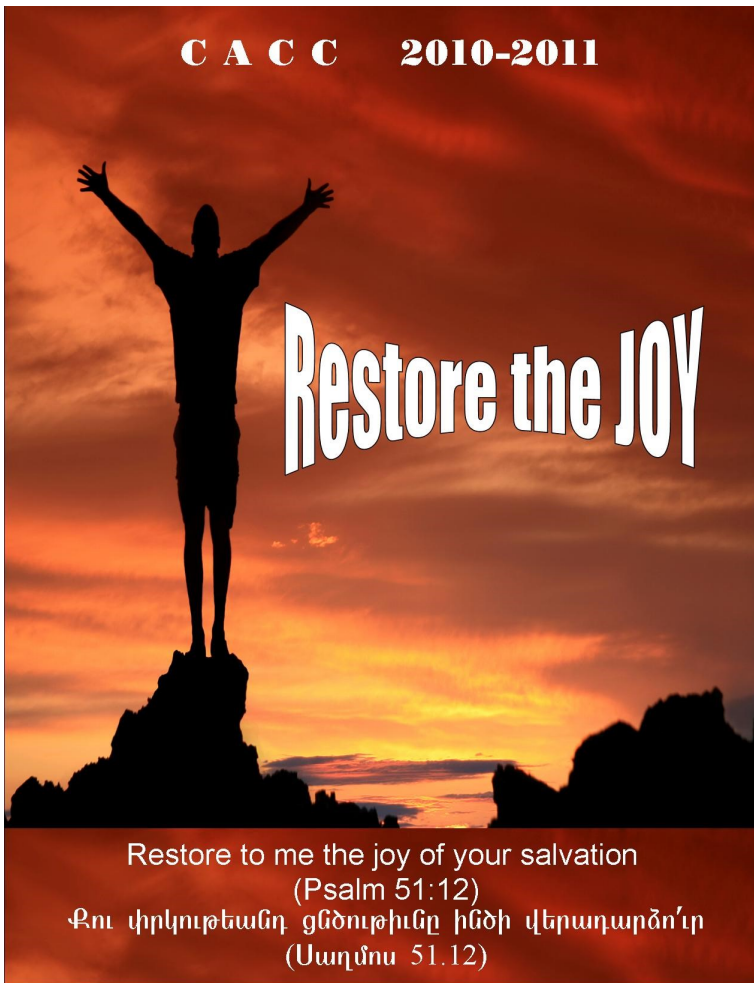

was a young boy, with a passion of music and poetry, as well as a fighter of lions and bears. But the most important virtue was that he was **a man after God's own heart** (1 Sam. 13:14). Every Christian believer should seek to be after God's own heart. We should seek to have hearts that beat with God's heart. This does not come automatically. Paul knew that our mind (heart) needs to be transformed every day. "Do not be conformed to this world, but **be transformed by the renewal of your mind**, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2).

Secondly, the issue of **maturity**. David and his friend Jonathan both learned to trust God completely. As they grew up, they also matured. There were trials in their lives. Jonathan challenged his father, the king. He stood firm without compromising the truth. He helped his friend David on the account of endangering even his own life. David was chased by the King Saul. David did not play any political game. Both David and Jonathan

The 20th Biennial Assembly of the Armenian Evangelical Union of North America (AEUNA) and the 17th convention of the Armenian Evangelical Youth Fellowship (AEYF) took place in Southfield, Michigan on July 8-11. The theme of this assembly was "Union in Christ."

The host church, the Detroit Armenian Congregational Church, with the leadership of its pastor, Rev. Makarios Darawi, did a fabulous job in organizing and hosting.

For the first time ever, the AEUNA and AEYF held their sessions together. It was great to have the young people not only worship with us and play music, but also to hear their views about various issues.

The theme of the assembly was presented throughout the convention in the following sessions: "Why I Love my Church," "Why I Love the Union," "Why do I Care About My Spiritual Maturity," and "Why Do I Need Vision."

The Business Meetings were devoted to issues that generated a lot of discussion and voicing of opinions.

Vacation Bible Camp

I'd like to give you an update about this past summer. God blessed our church, as we ventured into our Vacation Bible Camp 2010. About thirty-seven intelligent students, full of life, brought all their energy to CACC to worship, to sing, and learn about our Lord. After a worship and praise session each morning, our young teachers led the kids to partake in their study groups. The Bible lesson and Bible verse for the day were reinforced during this time.



We learned that God's Word is True, God's Word is Comforting, God's Word is Surprising, God's Word is Life-changing, and God's Word is for everyone. Each lesson focused on a Bible story. This year's theme was called The High Seas Expedition, since we spent much of our time on a ship, hearing about the comfort and surprising miracles

that God brought to prisoners Paul and Peter. We spent time digging further and sharing evidence of God's love, help, and comfort throughout our own lives.



It was not hard to notice their excitement and openness to share their own individual experiences and God's presence in their lives.

These kids reflecting upon their faith, learning about Jesus and the cross, and acknowledging that Christ has paid the punishment for our sins, is evidence of God's hand in this powerful ministry.

Our last lesson, God's Word is for Everyone, touched upon our role as Christians in this world. We are called to share out God's love and God's word, and these kids made a sincere effort to do just that. They participated in Samaritan's Purse's Operation Christmas Child and brought in boxes to be sent to children around the world this November.



They played games, made crafts, and enjoyed snacks, all relating to the Bible stories. They ended their day with singing and a wrap up-lesson. Thank you to all the volunteers who put forth their time and energy to make Vacation Bible Camp possible. To the congregation, I ask that we continue to pray for this very important ministry and remember in our prayers these children and their enduring relationship with our Lord.

did not compromise their faith in God and their commitment towards each other. This is maturity. I have a simple message to my readers: please examine your loyalty. We need to learn to have loyalty to Christ and to each other as the body of Christ.

The CACC slogan of the year is **Restore the JOY**. We chose this title from the Psalm 51:12. Maturity means allowing God to restore you. David confessed his sin and his joy was restored.

This is maturity. When our heart is close to God's heart, God will shape us daily. David was tempted to kill his enemy (Saul). Even cutting the edge of Saul's robe bothered his conscience (1 Sam. 24). David was indeed a man after God's own heart. No wonder God said to Samuel that He does not look to appearance but to the heart (1 Sam. 16:7).

We all can be after God's own heart. When we give our life to Him, when we surrender to Him, He will transform us. Trust Him, ask Him to restore the Joy of His salvation in your life.

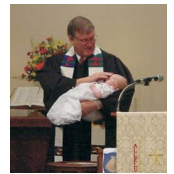
